General Meetings	28. An Annual General Meeting of the members shall be held in the month of January or as soon as possible thereafter for the purpose of electing Officers, Members of the General Committee for the ensuing year - elections shall be by the majority of votes, examining & passing the accounts, receiving the General Committee's report on the year's work, & transacting any other business relating to the Guild of which due notice has been given.
	29. At least one-quarter of the total membership of the Guild shall form a quorum.
	30. In the event of there being no quorum, the meeting shall be adjourned to the same day in the following week at a place and time to be appointed and should the number then present be insufficient to form a quorum, those present shall be considered a quorum, but they shall have no power to alter, amend or make additions to any of the existing rules.
	31. At least three clear day's notice of every meeting shall be sent to each member.
	32. Ten signatories shall be required to convene a General Meeting by the members.
Resignations	33. Any member resigning his or her membership shall given a month's notice in writing and shall settle all accounts with the Guild.
Expulsion.	34. Any member whose conduct is found, after full investigation and on being given the opportunity to be present by a General Meeting to be detrimental to the interest of the Guild or its members, shall be expelled and his/her name shall be posted up on the notice board.
Trustees	35. Immovable Property shall be vested in Trustees of 5 members to be appointed by a General Meeting.
	36. A General Meeting shall have power to remove any Trustee found unfit or guilty of misconduct or any other causes which render such Trustees incapable of carrying on. Vacancies in the trusteeship may be filled at a General Meeting. Notice of any proposal to remove a trustee from his/her trusteeship or to appoint a new trustee to fill a vacancy must be given by affixing in the premises of the Guild a document containing such proposal at least 2 weeks before the meeting at which the proposal is to be discussed. The result of such meeting shall then be notified to the Registrar of Societies for approval.
